Reverend Dr. Keith Norman

Senior Pastor, First Baptist Broad

Reverend Dr. Keith Norman is Senior Pastor of First Baptist Church Broad in Memphis, a role he has held since 2000, during which he has grown the congregation from 75 members to more than 4,500 and raised \$8.7 million to fund a five-phase campus expansion. He also serves as Vice President of Government Relations and Chief Community Relations Officer for Baptist Memorial Health Care, a role he has held since 2014, maintaining relationships across every level of government on public health issues. Norman was named a White House "Champion of Change" by President Obama for his work reducing youth violence in Memphis.



Freddie O'Connell

Mayor of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County

Freddie O'Connell is the tenth mayor of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, with an administration focused on affordability and quality of life for residents.
